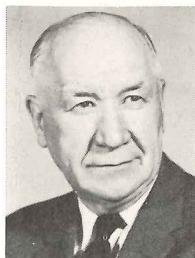

## The All-Colorado High School Band Colorado State College

THE All-Colorado High School Band was organized in 1952 for the exclusive purpose of providing superior students an opportunity to play with students of like ability. This purpose has not varied since the first band, composed of 182 students recommended by music teachers and band directors throughout the state, gathered on the campus.

Beginning in 1953, faculty members of the Colorado State College Division of Music conducted auditions throughout the state to select participants in the band. This practice has continued, and from 1953 to 1961, 4,577 students were auditioned for membership.

As many as 77 different high schools in Colorado have provided their top student musicians for the band in one year. Seventeen Colorado high schools have each been represented in the band by one or more students since 1952. The schools continuously represented are designated in the list of participating schools printed following the student membership list.

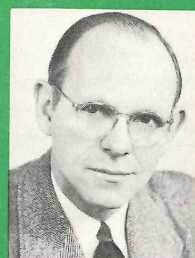
Outstanding guest conductors lead members of the band in rehearsals and in the final concert each year. These nationally recognized college and university conductors have all been selected for their vital and active interest in public school music.

## GUEST CONDUCTOR

**HUGH E. McMILLEN**, professor in the College of Music and director of the University of Colorado's famous bands, has had a distinguished music career.

He received his bachelor's degree in music from Northwestern University after studying at the Battle Creek Conservatory in Michigan and the Bush Conservatory in Chicago. He also holds a master's degree from the University of Colorado.

He is past president of Colorado Music Educators' Assn.; Colorado Instrumental Directors' Assn.; Southwest Division of the Music Educators' National Conference, and the College Band Directors' National Assn.

McMillen is a member of Phi Mu Alpha, national music honorary; member, Pi Kappa Lambda; past national president, Kappa Kappa Psi, national band honorary for men; national sponsor, Tau Beta Sigma, women's national honorary band fraternity, and member, American Band Masters' Assn.

McMillen has served as guest conductor and guest lecturer at the following: the universities of Michigan, Minnesota, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Mississippi, Missouri, Texas, and South Dakota, Brigham Young and Washington State Universities, as well as Iowa State Teachers College and the National Music Camp, Interlochen, Mich.

He has also been a guest conductor at music clinics and festivals throughout the middle and western portions of the United States.
