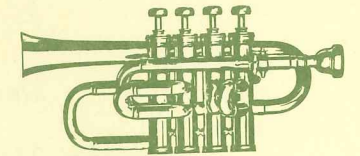

Randall Spicer, Professor of Music and Director of Bands, Washington State University, Pullman, Washington

GUEST CONDUCTOR

Randall Spicer is professor of Music and director of bands at Washington State University in Pullman. Over 230 students participate in the band program which includes **The Wind Ensemble, The Symphonic Band, The Concert Band, The Football Marching Band, Basketball Bands, Stage Bands and Chamber Music Organizations.** The concert bands are heard regularly over station KWSU and the Cougar network in the northwest. The Symphonic Band has performed at state, regional and national music conventions.

Mr. Spicer's performing medium is the woodwind instruments. He has appeared as soloist, clinician and/or guest conductor in 26 states and Canada.

He is listed among the **Men of Note** (Instrumentalist Magazine), **Making America Musical** (School Musician Magazine), and **America's Band Conductors** (The Music Journal). His articles have appeared in music journals and textbooks.

Mr. Spicer taught in the public schools of Colorado before moving to Washington State. His high school bands received all first divisions in playing, sight reading and marching. An honors graduate at the University of Colorado, he has also attended many of the festivals in Aspen, Colorado and the National Clarinet Clinics in Denver. He has done advanced studies at Michigan State University and has taught summer sessions in Colorado, Texas, Oregon, Minnesota and Saskatchewan, Canada. He is a member of The American Bandmasters Association and an honorary member of Kappa Kappa Psi and Phi Beta Mu. He is a past president of the Northwest College Band Directors Association and a current member of the research committees of the A.B.A. and the C.B.D.N.A.
