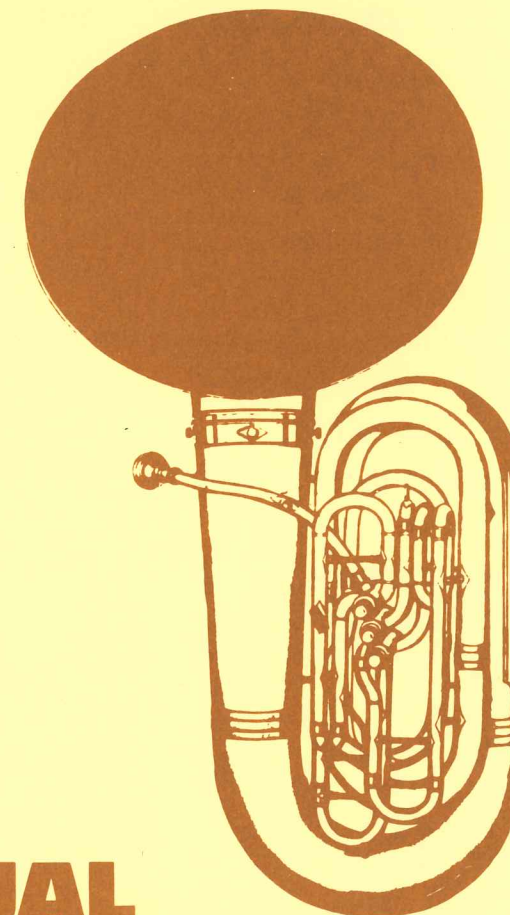

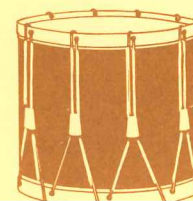

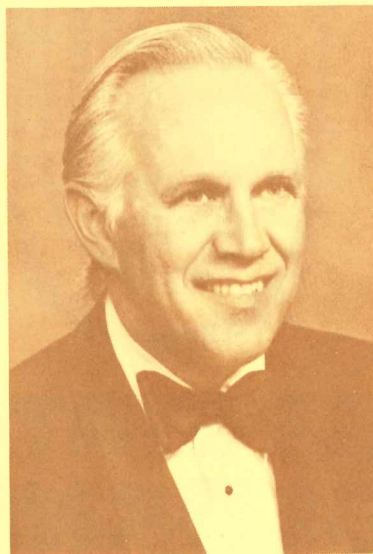

Guest Conductor



William D. Cole is presently Director of Bands and Professor of Music at Western Washington State College, Bellingham, Washington — a position he has held since September, 1970. He has a B.S. Degree in Music Education from the University of Illinois and a Master of Arts Degree in Conducting from the University of Washington.

Prior to his present position, Professor Cole was Director of the Marching Band and Concert Band at the University of Washington from 1957 to 1970. His "Husky" Marching Band appeared at the Rose Bowl and Pasadena Tournament of Roses Parade in 1960, 1961, and 1964.

In 1972 the Western Workshop Band (Stage Band) was winner of the Northwest Intercollegiate Stage Band Festival and appeared at Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. The Western Jazz Combo won the 1971 Northwest Intercollegiate Jazz Combo competition and performed at the Intercollegiate Jazz Festival held at the University of Illinois.

Professor Cole was principal trumpet of the Seattle Symphony Orchestra from 1947 to 1964 and played performances under the baton of Stravinsky, Stokowski, Beecham, Villa Lobos, Fiedler, Wallenstein and others. As a professional trumpet player in Los Angeles he toured with the Les Brown Dance Band in 1947. He studied trumpet with the late Louis Maggio.

Professor Cole is very active as an adjudicator, clinician and festival director of bands and orchestra throughout the Northwest states and has also conducted honor bands or All-State Bands in Canada, Alaska, Hawaii, California, Colorado and Texas.

He is a member of the American Bandmasters Association and College Band Directors National Association. He is past president of the Washington Music Educators Association and is presently President-elect of the Northwest Music Educators Association. He is also listed in the Marquis' "Who's Who in Western States."
