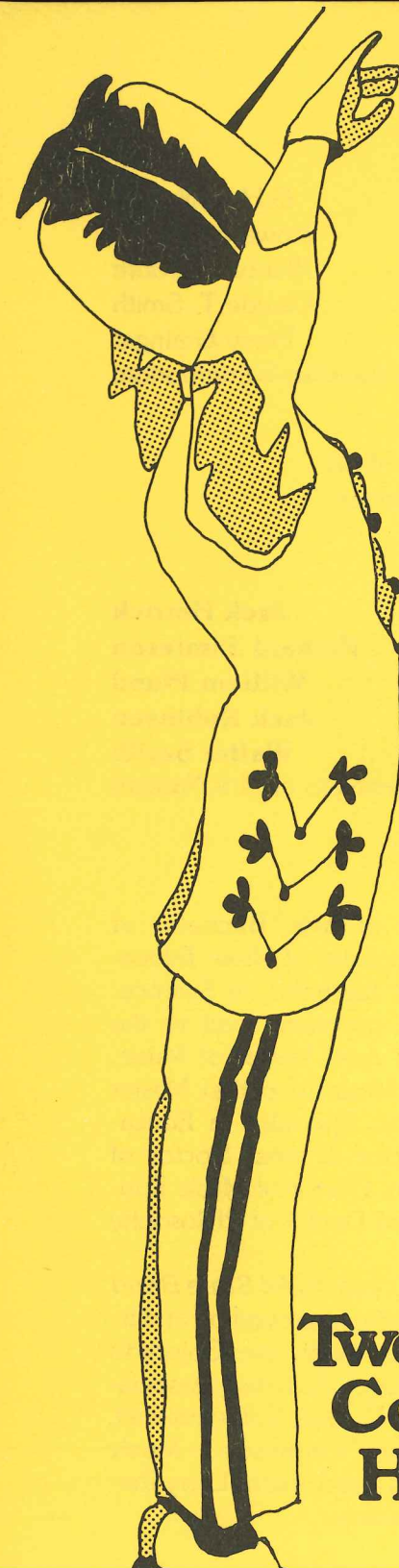

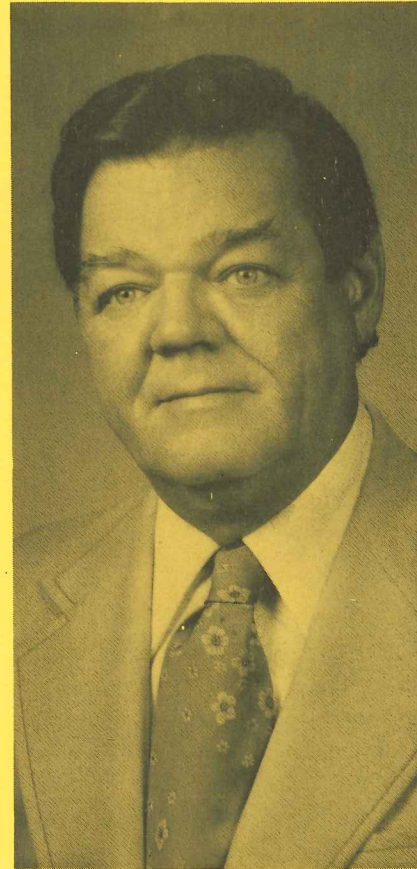

Guest Conductor

Gene Witherspoon serves as Head of the Music Department and Director of Bands at Arkansas Technological University in Russellville, Arkansas. During his 27-year tenure there, his bands have been featured on three national convention programs--those of the Music Educators National Conference (M.E.N.C.) in 1966, the College Band Directors National Association in 1967 and the American School Band Directors National Association in 1969. In 1974, the Tech Band was featured at the College Band Directors National Convention Program in Houston and in 1975, at the 17-state Bi-Regional Convention in Omaha. In addition, it has been featured at many regional M.E.N.C. and other professional conventions.

Mr. Witherspoon was named a member of the American Bandmasters Association in 1971. He served as President of the seven-state southwest Division of M.E.N.C. in 1968-69, Vice-president in 1970-71 and a member of the national board for four years. He is a charter member and past president of the Arkansas Music Educators Association, the Arkansas College Band Directors Association, and the Arkansas Chapter of Phi Beta Mu.

Mr. Witherspoon is currently serving as chairman of Region 9, National Association of Schools of Music Accrediting Association. He has served as guest conductor of all-state groups in Alabama, Mississippi, Missouri, New Jersey, Texas, Virginia, Illinois and Arkansas. He also has served as clinician, guest conductor and workshop director in 14 additional states. In 1976, he received the National Band Association's "Citation of Excellence" and also the Arkansas Bandmasters Association "Bandmaster of the Year" award.

The Arkansas Tech Summer Music Camp opened in 1964 and reached a record enrollment in 1976 of 1,600 students, making it one of the largest summer music camps in America. Mr. Witherspoon also has served a guest conductor of summer music camps at Purdue University, the University of Missouri, Northwest Missouri State College, Central Missouri State College, Texas Christian University, Oklahoma State University, Oral Roberts University, Drake University and other institutions throughout the Southwest.
