Guest Conductor

A nationally known conductor and performer, William H. Hill has guest-conducted and performed in concerts and clinics in over 32 states. He is an active free-lance composer in the Los Angeles area and has over 20 compositions in print. He has written hundreds of arrangements for various groups; and his works have been performed by university and high school bands, orchestras and choirs throughout the United States. His composition, *Danses Sacred and Profane*, won the 1977 ABA-Ostwald Grand Prize. In 1976, *Sonitus Revelationis* was the first runner-up in the same contest.

In addition to being the Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Music at California State University, Los Angeles, Mr. Hill also teaches theory, orchestration, conducting, and Symphonic Band literature. He and his wife, Janet, are co-authors of *Sounds for Tomorrow*, elementary band folio published by Neil A. Kjos Company.

Under the direction of Mr. Hill, the California State University Wind Ensemble has performed at the National Association of Wind Ensemble Conductors, Western Division College Band Directors National Association, Western Division of Music Educators National Conference and California Music Educators. In 1975 the Symphonic Band and Wind Ensemble performed at the Geneva and Montreux Music Festivals in Switzerland as well as broadcast



performances and recordings in Italy and Germany.

In the fall of 1977, the Wind Ensemble will be recording in the *Authenticated Composer Series* for Golden Crest Records, performing Mr. Hill's compositions. The group will also, during the fall season, perform for the National Association of Music Therapists.

Mr. Hill received his B.A., B.M., and M.A. from the University of Northern Colorado and has done advanced graduate work at U.C.L.A.
