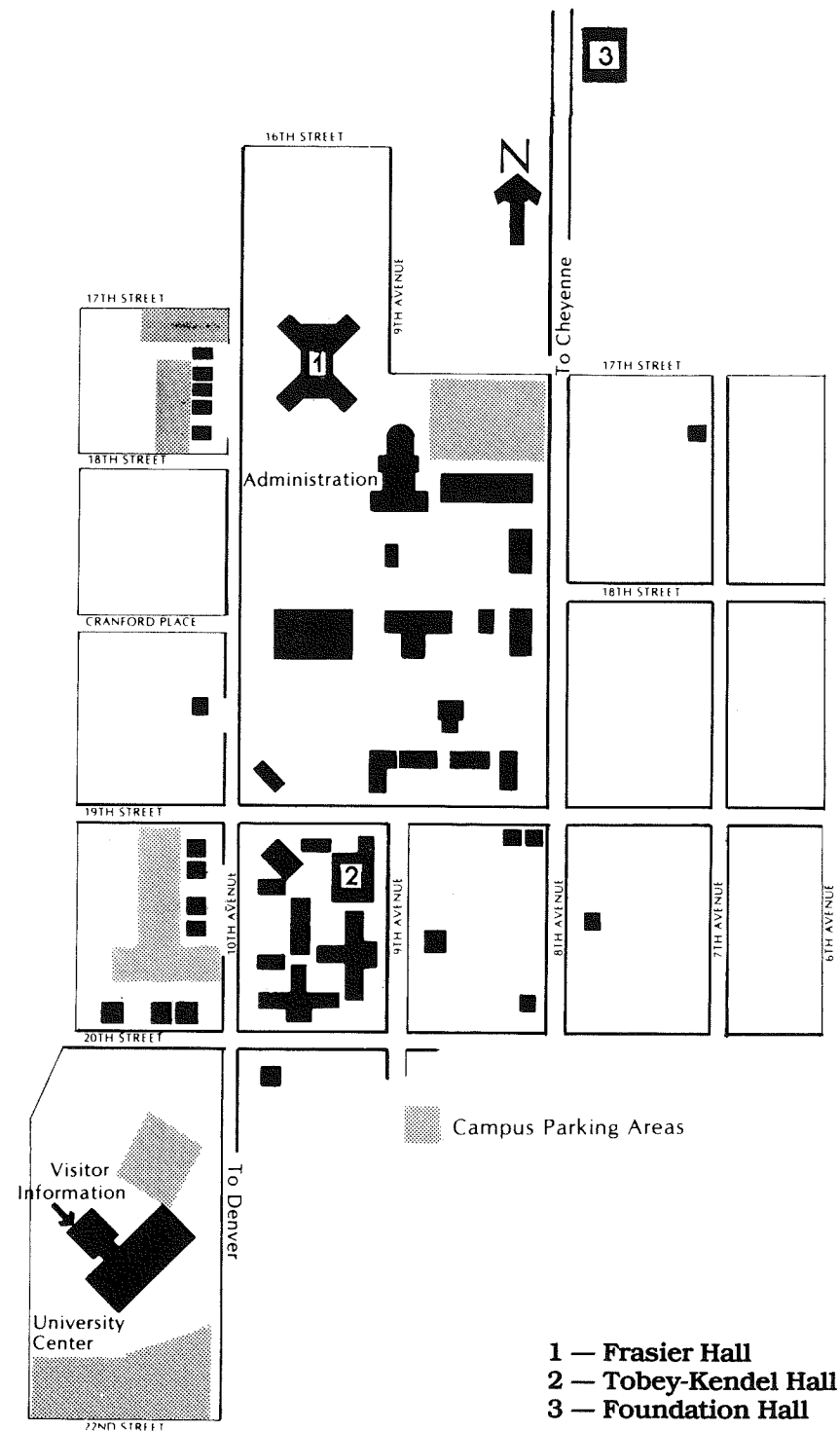

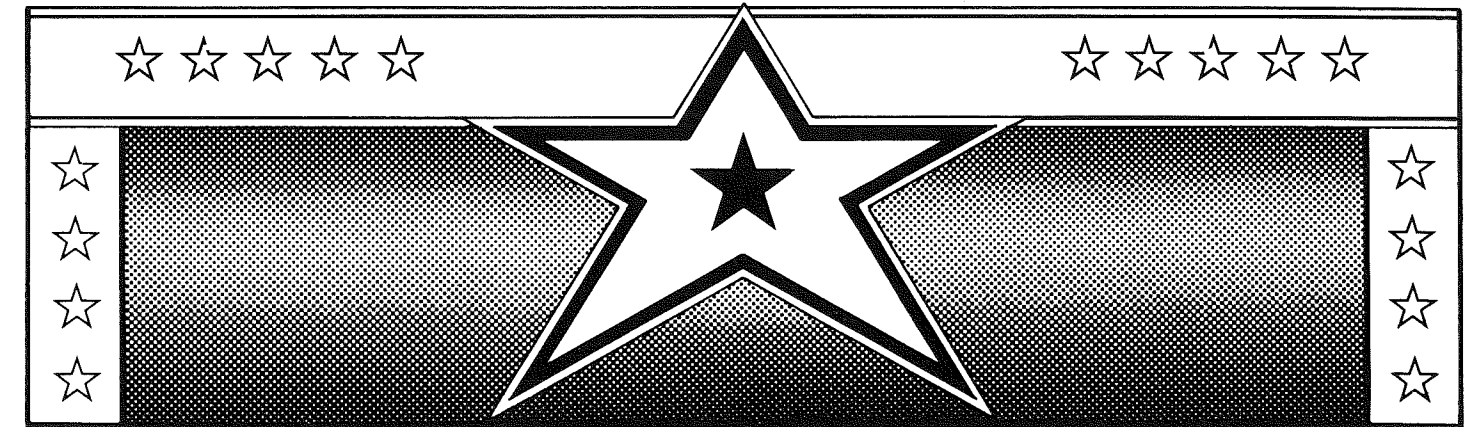

### MEET YOUR 1984 CELEBRITY CONDUCTOR

Born and educated in California, Benton Minor has devoted his professional life to music and to music education.

He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree and a California Secondary Teaching credential at University of California at Los Angeles, and a Master of Arts in Music Education at Claremont Graduate School. He began his teaching career in the Grossmont High School District in 1953; in 1967, he received an appointment as a member of the music faculty at California State University, Fullerton. While at CSUF, he has served as Coordinator of the Instrumental Area and as Chairman of the Department of Music in addition to conducting the Wind Ensemble, the Symphonic Band, and the University Orchestra.

While teaching at the high school level, his bands gained a wide reputation for excellence in concert and marching. Bands under his direction won numerous sweepstakes awards in marching including the All Western Band Review in Long Beach, California on eight occasions and also

appeared in Salt Lake City for the Music Educators' Conference.

He has served as guest conductor for county and state honor bands in California, Arizona, Nevada, and Hawaii including such groups as the California All-State High School Honor Band and the Southern California High School Honor Band.

Minor has been active in professional organizations both as an active member and as an officer. He has been elected to the following offices: President, California Band Directors' Association; President, Southern California School Band and Orchestra Association; Band Representative, California Music Educators' Association.

In 1982, the California State University Wind Ensemble under his direction was invited to perform in Tokyo, Japan, for events sponsored by the Japan Band Directors' Association. The ensemble spent fourteen days in Japan in October and November for the tour.

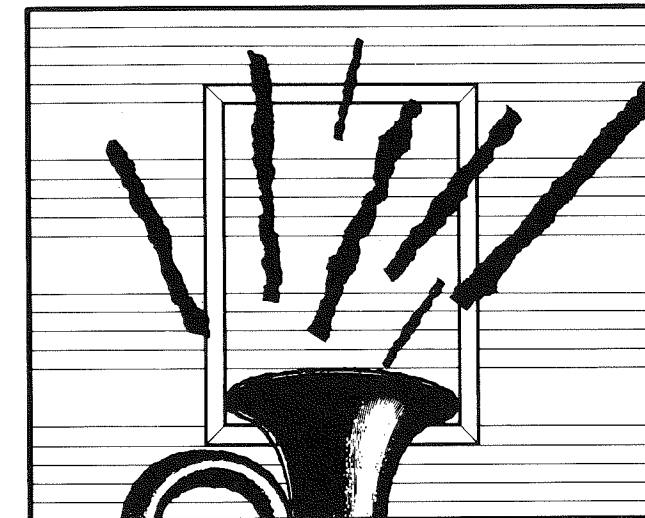

UNIVERSITY BANDS

**WIND ENSEMBLE** — The Wind Ensemble, the first of six groups within the Band Department, is an assemblage of the most outstanding wind and percussion majors in the University of Northern Colorado School of Music. Using the player pool concept, the Ensemble performs a repertoire ranging from works requiring as few as ten players to as many as seventy. Flexible instrumentation and player rotation provide members of the ensemble with a variety of responsibilities, challenges, and playing experiences.

The Wind Ensemble has appeared at the Southwestern Music Educators Conference, the Colorado Music Educators National Association Convention, and the College Band Directors National Convention in Ann Arbor, Michigan. A recording of the Ann Arbor performance is available through Crest Records. In addition, the Ensemble has released five albums, *New Directions*, *Spheres of Influence*, *Omnibus*, *Reflections*, and *Imagination and Beyond*. The Ensemble also has been featured on the National Public Radio Program, *Windworks*, which was broadcast throughout the United States and Canada.



**SYMPHONY BAND** — The Symphony Band is an organization of approximately eighty musicians selected from the finest performers on campus. Although most members are music majors, students specializing in other fields often qualify for this ensemble through audition.

Literature for the band is drawn from the finest contemporary and traditional repertoire. Players in this group are afforded the opportunity to perform in flexible sized ensembles which are determined by the composer's concepts of instrumentation and timbre. This highly skilled band maintains an active performance schedule throughout the year.

**CONCERT BAND** — The Concert Band is a sixty-piece ensemble made up of music majors and students from other disciplines. Band members perform a wide variety of interesting literature selected from standard and current repertoire. Musicians in the Concert Band are provided the opportunity to increase their performance skills through an active and challenging involvement with the creative process. The band offers non-music majors an avenue to continue making music throughout their college career and provides music majors with a quality experience in their chosen field.

Dear All-State Band Members,


