**All-State Band Clinicians**

**Lowell E. Graham**

Lt. Col. Lowell E. Graham is commander and conductor of the United States Air Force Band, "America's International Musical Ambassadors" and "The Chief's Own," Washington, D.C. He assumed command on Sept. 15, 1995. Originally from Greeley, his career in the Air Force began in 1974.

Col. Graham is a graduate of UNC, where he earned a bachelor of arts degree in music education in 1970 and a master of arts degree in performance in 1971. In 1977, he was the first person awarded a doctorate of musical arts in orchestral conducting from the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.

He was director of instrumental music at Colby Community College, Kansas, when he auditioned to become a U.S. Air Force band leader, and was selected as assistant director and deputy commander of the Air Force Band of the West at Lackland Air Force Base, Texas. In 1975 he became conductor of the U.S. String Orchestra and Strolling Strings at Bolling Air Force Base, Washington, D.C., a position he held for six years.

Col. Graham has performed at numerous international, national, and state musical events that include the Association of Concert Bands, Music Educators National Conference, and the International Viola Congress. His conducting appearances include the Green Bay Symphony Orchestra and the Virginia Symphony Orchestra, along with honor bands, orchestras, festivals and camps nationwide.

In addition, he has piloted recordings for Klavier International, Wilson Audiophile and Telarc International commercial labels. He received a Grammy for the 1993 Telarc recording of P.D.Q. Bach's "Grand Serenade for an Awful Lot of Winds and Percussion." His radio and television credits include conducting, script writing and musical production for American Public Radio, live telecast concerts and video productions.

In March 1995, he was selected for membership into the prestigious American Bandmasters Association, the profession association of master conductors and musicians. And in February 1996, Colonel Graham was inducted into the University of Northern Colorado School of Music "Hall of Honor."



**Tim Lautzenheiser**

Tim Lautzenheiser is a well-known name in the music education world as a teacher, clinician, author, composer, consultant, adjudicator, and (above all) a trusted friend to anyone interested in working with young people in developing a *desire for excellence*.

His own career involves ten years of successful college band directing at Northern Michigan University, the University of Missouri, and New Mexico State University. During this time Tim developed highly acclaimed groups in all areas of the instrumental and vocal field.

Following three years in the music industry, he created *Attitude Concepts for Today*, an organization designed to manage the many requests for workshops, seminars and convention speaking engagements focusing on the area of positive attitude and effective leadership training. In addition, Tim is presently serving in the faculty at Duquesne University and VanderCook College of Music.

Tim's books, produced by *G.I.A. Publications*, *The Art of Successful Teaching*, and *The Joy of Inspired Teaching*, are best sellers on the music profession. He is also co-author of Hal Leonard's popular band method book, *Essential Elements*, and the creator and writer of the highly acclaimed *Director's Communication Kits*.

Tim is a graduate of Ball State University and the University of Alabama. He was recently awarded an Honorary Doctorate Degree from VanderCook College of Music. In November, 1995 Tim was presented with the distinguished *Sudler Order of Merit* from the John Philip Sousa Foundation.
